Hi everyone

I am sure you will have all seen the guidance on restart that has been issued by The Scout Association, there may be a lot, but it is well worth taking time to familiarise yourself with it. I recently met with the District Commissioners and District Restart Champions to plan a consistent way ahead for Scouting in the County, it was a really positive meeting and I would like to thank everyone for their efforts so far. It was also great to see that we have restart champions in every District. I thought I would share with you the key points that I heard loud and clear from the call:

- The safety of our young people, adults and communities is essential, we all need to follow the guidelines to help us achieve this.
- We are now in “amber” which means for sections that want to meet in small groups outdoors start planning and working on your risk assessments.
- A risk assessment is vital and even in “amber” face-to-face Scouting must not take place until these are approved.
- If Leaders do not feel comfortable or are unable to offer face-to-face Scouting then they have my full support.
- Virtual Scouting will continue to have an important role to play and a blended programme will be essential.
- The restart of face-to-face Scouting is going to be easier for some Groups than others. For example some will have easier access to suitable outdoor space or greater availability of leadership teams. For restart to be a true success we need to all work together to ensure no groups or sections are left behind. Some Groups will be able to restart sooner than others— please share your experiences so others can learn from you.
- The guidance issued by The Scout Association is clear that Leaders must have their Safety and Safeguarding training up to date before risk assessments are signed off. Please ensure that yours is up to date to avoid any issues.

Districts Restart Champions and District Commissioners will be working closely with all Groups and Sections over the coming weeks as things change.

In addition to the fantastic work the Restart Champions are doing, I am pleased to say that the County have agreed to spend £15,000 and provide all Sections with the basic equipment to start safely. These basic equipment packs will include 12 weeks worth of hand sanitiser, anti-bacterial spray, gloves, aprons and masks

Thank you for your continued commitment and determination to offer the best possible programme to young people in Nottinghamshire.

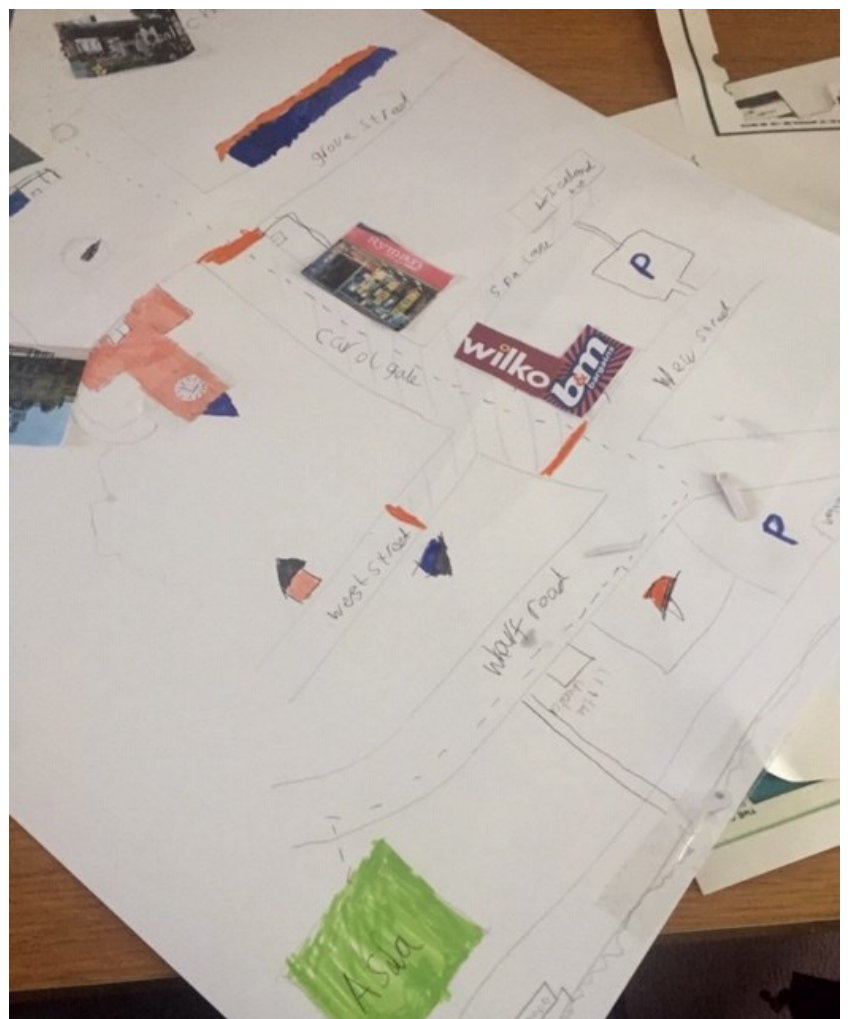
