Hi everyone

I hope you had an enjoyable Christmas and New Year – more importantly still, I hope that it was safe for you and your loved ones.

Despite us all being back in a national lockdown and all Scouting activities being delivered virtually I know that it remains exceptionally busy. Everyone remains under a variety of different pressures and it essential that we keep being kind to one another and provide virtual support where we can.

For the remainder of my spiel, I wanted to focus on census and further help that is on its way.

### 1, Census

This years census is probably the most important one in the history of our county – without it we are simply not going to know which Groups and Sections need the support. There are 3 clear messages from me on census:

1. Please complete it accurately in the knowledge that financial support will be there for Groups and Sections who need it.
2. Census is not a numbers game – it is a team game. We can't help the struggling parts of the team if we don't know where they are.
3. There will be a further census in October 2021 with delayed capitation until February/March 2022. Support will be available for this as well.

### 2, Help is on the way!

We have listened to you and understand that finance is actually not the largest concern in many Groups – the loss of adults and young people most certainly are though. There are 2 countywide initiatives that will shortly be rolled out to help:

A set of **adult recruitment materials** are being professionally designed and produced. They aim to provide the “starter for 10” conversation for Leaders to talk with potential volunteers across a variety of roles – Leaders, Supporters, Trustees etc. The materials will also be designed for use on social media and a campaign will be designed around them too. In addition to the materials we are looking to make sure the induction process runs smoother – we simply have to make the most of every individual who volunteers for us.

County wide **Beaver recruitment campaign**. We know that during the pandemic a large number of Beavers will have moved up to Cubs – meaning numbers will be low. A strong Beaver colony is an essential part of a thriving group so we want to make sure colonies recover quickly. All young people in Nottinghamshire of Beaver age will be contacted through schools. This will be through a flier that also doubles up as a craft, an electronic version will also be available. Young people wishing to join will be coordinated via the County Office. In addition we know that first experiences are important – we will be providing at least a terms worth of programme ideas for all Beaver colonies to use if they wish. This should help those who need a little more support to keep their new recruits. If census shows this approach is needed in other sections then we can run something similar for them too.

Finally (and I know keep saying it but, I really do mean it), a huge thank you for everyone's efforts, - they have made and will continue to make a positive difference across our county.

Looking forward to 2021, we will again be asking those of you who have not completed Safety and Safeguarding to complete it, more training events are being planned with some modules being presented virtually these will be advertised as soon as they are available.

### Quick guide to changes

All Leaders must complete getting started within 5 months of taking on their appointment, that is Module 1, Safety, Safeguarding and GDPR which can now be completed online, module 3 or 4 (for Managers) the learning is available online but will still need to be validated by your TA.

All Trustees must complete the Trustee Introduction module, unless trustee training was done prior to September 2020.

All adults (excluding Occasional Helpers ) must complete GDPR and must keep their Safety and Safeguarding Training up to date.

All Leaders must complete their wood badge training within 3 years of starting their role

If you need any further information on what training you require for your role please look on the training website ([www.training.notts-scouts.org.uk](http://www.training.notts-scouts.org.uk)) alternatively talk to your manager, Training Adviser or Local Training Manager all should be able to help you.

I am looking forward to seeing more adults complete their training this year with the introduction of new training opportunities.
