Hi everyone

I hope you are all keeping safe and well? I wanted to use this piece to look at the here and now and then look forward.

You will all know that the Government has delayed the lifting of restrictions. The great news is that this is not stopping sections getting back to face to face in a safe way. Everywhere I look I can see numbers recovering. I also know from talking to many of you that in many sections numbers are higher than they have been for many years. This reflects the huge efforts that volunteers are putting in, the challenge for us all is to keep it going and I absolutely want to make sure the County helps with this. The County Leadership Team are looking at this and are moving forward on ideas such as County Camps, County Conferences and Programme Support. I am however conscious that Nottinghamshire is your County and therefore your input and suggestions as to how we sustain momentum are always welcome – feel free to drop me a line – steven.tupper@notts-scouts.org.uk.

As well as young people recruitment, the message I'm getting is that adult recruitment seems to be easier too. Groups are having successes posting on community social media sites and by simply asking for support. Remember a lot of people don't know you need support unless you ask and in a positive way. Don't forget the great materials to help you with this available on the [County website](#) and the national materials as part of the [#GoodForYou](#) campaign.

What has become ever clearer as we move through the readiness levels is that there is no absolute amber or yellow, there are many different shades. I can see this continuing as we head to green, so to manage expectations I don't see green being the return to no restrictions on activity. We have managed this well so far and I can't see any reason why we won't going forward. The key to this success so far have been sections keeping their programmes simple and local – if we stick to this we won't go far wrong.

Many of you will have seen information on the new section for 4-6 year old's called [Squirrels](#). Through the Group Scout Leaders in the County we asked for initial interest and a small number of groups have taken up the challenge. We'll be sharing the learning from these with everyone. New Groups are welcome to join the trial to, however you must do so through myself and your District Commissioner. Under no circumstances are Squirrel Sections to start without going through this process because you and the young people won't be insured. If you would like to be involved in supporting the new Squirrel Sections from a County perspective, please let me know – steven.tupper@notts-scouts.org.uk.

Finally, I'd like to let you know that I have agreed to continue in my role as County Commissioner through until at least May 2024. The ambition I set when I started over 3 years ago was for everyone to feel part of the County, we are closer to that aim but are certainly not there yet. Let's keep working towards the ambition together and in doing so grow a County that I'm very proud to lead.

Wood badges

Well done to the 20 Leaders who have completed their wood badge this year, it always gives me great pleasure to approve wood badges in recognition of the work you do to complete the training.

LTM's and TA's across the County are there to support and validate so please contact your TA to kick start your validations, your name could be the next on the list for achieving your wood badge.

Mandatory Training - Safety and Safeguarding

As adults as we start to get back to face to face scouting with our young people Safety should be at the centre of all we do. Over the last few months there has been a major push for adults to have up to date Safety and Safeguarding training. Thank you for all of you who have completed the training, the response has been fantastic.

Safety and Safeguarding training should be renewed every 3 years and not be allowed to lapse so it is important that all adults keep their safety and safeguarding training up to date and if you receive a reminder that it is out of date either from Gilwell or County that you complete it as soon as possible.

Mandatory Training - First Response - Changes to time scale

Originally the national steer was that expired first aid certificates would be extended by 6 months from the point we move to green. This has now changed and now all expired certificates must be updated by 1 January 2022. We expect a similar hard line approach will be taken for first aid as we have seen for safety and safeguarding training.

In Nottinghamshire we are using a blended approach to help as many adults complete their training as easily as possible:

Module 10A: online learning followed by a session on zoom. You can already book onto these here: <https://training.notts-scouts.org.uk/>

Module 10B: face-to-face session lasting no more than 30 minutes to cover a) approach to and assessment of scene / incident; b) CPR for an adult; c) CPR for a child. These sessions will be advertised soon and delivered locally.

We recognise the blended approach doesn't work for everyone. So will be looking to run some face to face sessions, however the ask is that adults complete using the blended approach wherever possible.
