Mandatory First aid training

Doing things safely is fundamental to everything we do in Scouts, and completing the first aid training - also known as First Response course - is a key part in that.

We recognise that renewing or gaining for the first time has not been easy over the last 2 years but we now require all leaders to have a valid first aid/response as a minimum qualification so we are compliant with the rules of the Scouts Association.

How to complete it

First aid training can be completed by:

- 1. Face-to-face 6 hour training course
- 2. Blended approach which is made up of 3 sessions e-learning, virtual and a final practical validation, all 3 sessions must be completed.

Over the coming months there are opportunities to complete your First Aid

By Face to face sessions, full 6 hour course

Courses are available on 1st October 2022, 20th November 2022 and 11th December More details can be found on training.notts-scouts.org.uk, or by

The Blended Learning Approach which combines a 2.5 hour e-learning with a two hour online session for the theory part of the training (10A). The practical validation (10B) is a short (15-20min) face-to-face session, which covers the practical elements of the life support training.

The eLearning can be accessed via training.notts-scouts.org.uk, once completed you can book for part 2 online virtual session a live video call facilitated by a first aid trainer, with some more detailed knowledge checking exercises and discussions.

You can only attend the practical validation once the theory part (both eLearning and online session) is completed.

How do I book?

Face to face sessions have limited spaces and must be booked by following the link on training.notts-scouts.org.uk to the training calendar

Or follow the link to first aid training where you can register for part 1 of the blended approach and once complete will be able to book parts 2 (virtual session) and part 3 (practical validation)

Blended learning approach

If you have already started the blended learning approach this needs to be completed as soon as possible, again dates for the virtual and practical sessions can be found on training.notts-scouts.org.uk.

PLAN: A debate / an activity about Parliament / a trip to see democracy in action (e.g. local council) / a visit from a local politician.

LEAD: A debate / a game or activity about Parliament or democracy / A decision making forum.

REPRESENT: Write to a local politician to tell them how great your section is / write an article for the local paper about the fun you had taking part in UKPW / Present the results of your sections voting to your group or district executive.

Walesby Forest's emergency rescue weekend is back!

Over the weekend (**7th - 9th October**) you will experience a range of training and perform rescues from:

- Fighting fires
- Cutting open car doors
- Gaining new first aid skills
- Training to carry out a search on a missing person
- Water rescue



The event only has 78 places available for this one special weekend.

Cost is £60 per person which includes training, food (Friday tea to Sunday lunch) and camping fees for the weekend.

Leaders are not required to stay on site, we will have multiple permit holders to cover this event and look after the children for you.

Scouts can sign up on their own or with friends within scouting.
