The **census** that many of you completed in February showed that across the County we'd grown by over 300 young people (4-18yrs) and just under 200 adults. Together this means there are now just

under 10,000 people in Nottinghamshire actively involved in Scouting. This is a significant achievement and my thanks goes out to everyone across the county for making it happen. Our target for the coming year has to be to get back above pre-covid numbers of young people, but we need to do this in a way that is manageable. There are a couple of tools out there that might be able to help:



Notts Scouts Adventure



Notts Scouts Adventure is the name of the Notts Scouts Activities team.

We have used this name and not Hoveringham Activity Centre, as our team is much more than the water activities provided at Hoveringham. We provide Adventure activities for Nottinghamshire Scouts, which include water sports, archery, hillwalking and rock climbing and we are all passionate about giving youngsters opportunities in the outdoors that challenge them.

The team comprises of about 100 adults from across the County and even a few from other Counties, many of which have other roles in Scouting in Groups and Districts. Any adults are welcome to join us, we have lots of adult opportunities in April and September this year - see our website for more details https://bookwhen.com/nsa2023

The bookings so for this year have been great. Nearly all weekend places are filled; the only one with spaces on is the **Explorer Scout Water Activity Days** on 6th and the 7th May and costs £20.

Here are a few opportunities where we do have availability:

Adults Climbing Weekend - Held in Derbyshire 15th & 16th April (book online). We are trying to grow the team so anyone is welcome whether beginners or those looking for permits.

Rock Climbing Wall evenings - We have a whole series of climbing wall sessions available both at Hollygate Campsite, Cotgrave and at Hoveringham. We tried this out last year at Hollygate and they proved really popular with Cubs & Scouts; even a Beaver Colony had a go.

Come & Try it Evenings - Held at Hoveringham for sailing, paddlesports and archery. Lots of dates available from our first night on the 19th April throughout May, June & July.

Paddlesports Course - Fancy trying canoeing, kayaking and stand up paddleboarding (SUP)? Maybe you've already had a go and would like to develop your skills? We've got an eight week course aimed at both beginners and intermediates to learn and develop their canoeing, kayaking and SUP skills. This course is for Scouts and Explorers only and participants must be over 10.5 years old on the first night of the course.

Induction Training

In February we welcomed 16 newish leaders from across the County to Robin Hood Activity Centre and through a series of activities, practical skills, presentations and guest speakers we set them all off on a journey to gain their wood badge. From the fundamentals of Scouting to running safe activities, planning fun, quality programmes and the skills needed to run a residential experience, promoting positive behaviour we covered it all.



It was great to be back delivering a weekend for new leaders if you have less than a year's experience in your role or are new to Scouting.

Getting Out Training – Introduction to and Skills of a Residential Experience (Modules 16 and 32)

This is a great opportunity to gain skills to run a residential experience for your young people and the

learning you need to gain your nights away permit. It is suitable for new leaders, those with some experience or for those who want to brush up on their skills. The next weekend is 22nd and 23rd April 2023 at Notts Scouts Adventure at Hoveringham so if you have not used or seen the facilities they have to offer it is a great chance to see them for yourself. Don't miss out on this fabulous opportunity.



Mandatory Training

Keeping our young people safe should be central to everything we do, so we expect all leaders, managers, supporters, section assistants and SASU members to keep their mandatory training up to date.

Safety, safeguarding training need to be completed every 3 years. Leaders and managers are required to have up to date first response qualification In Nottinghamshire we offer 2 ways to gain you First Response qualification:

- Blended approach which consists an e-learning theory session, a trainer lead virtual validation session and a short practical validation.
- Full 6 hour face to face course.

Trustee's are required to complete the Trustee introduction training. All adults also need to complete TSA GDPR training. All details, links and booking details can be found on training.notts-scouts.org.uk.

New Notts Necker

We're excited to announce that we now have a new Nottinghamshire Scouts Neckerchief! Many of you will have recently seen members of the County team walking around with question cards and potential designs, and more importantly, many of you will have heard us talking to our members to get their views.

As a youth shaped organisation, it was important that our young people had the formative and final say on what our new necker was to look like. I am confident in saying that by listening to what our young people said, we have ended up with a meaningful and distinguishable necker that we can wear with pride.



We've spent a lot of time over recent months asking young people 'what do you think represents Nottinghamshire?'. Using the creative answers we received, we sat down with some design gurus and tasked them with putting together a number of designs that each focused on the most popular answers amongst our young people. Once we received the designs, we printed them off, laminated them, and merrily carried them around the county to ask our young people and adult volunteers for their feedback, and for a vote on their favourite.

We spoke to a whole range of young people and adults at all sorts of fun and adventurous sessions and events, from our youngest, to our not-so, and by the end there was a clear winner - Blue, Yellow and Green with Robin Hood! In quizzing one young person as to why they'd picked Robin Hood over the other Nottinghamshire designs, I was told 'We already wear the Major Oak on our arms, so it makes sense to wear Robin Hood too!' - I couldn't have summed it up better myself.

Over the coming weeks and months, volunteers holding roles representing the County will be receiving their New Notts Necker, in fact, some are already wearing it with pride now, so do keep your eyes open to see if you can spot it! Going forward, recipients of County awards will also be presented with a New Notts Necker - recognising that we're all part of Team Notts, and by working together as a team, we're an unbreakable force for good.

I hope you'll agree that the fantastic young people that were given the difficult task of being quizzed have done an outstanding job, and have helped us produce a necker that we can wear with pride. Allow me to take this opportunity to thank you all for the hard work you continue to put into Scouts on a regular basis - without you, there isn't a Nottinghamshire Scouts, and there's no replacement for the **SkillsForLife** that we provide - we're ever so grateful for all you continue to do.

Community Mini Bus

As a Youth Group we had the opportunity to have a Mini Bus. The Bus seats 15 people (including the driver). We are members of 'The Community Transport Association' and it is fully insured. It is normally hired out as a self-drive to 'non for profit organisations'. There are some age restrictions for the drivers, this depends on how an event is funded.

The bus has a full tank of fuel and is to be returned with a full tank. The hire costs are £50 a day and £25 for half a day.

We also have two trailers that are available for hire either with or without hiring the bus.
